THE SUMMER SOLSTICE –

MATCH OF THE RIVERBANKS –

a traditional twenty-four hour basketball marathon right in the heart of Rīga. The participants are two teams – the residents of the right and the left bank of Daugava.



THE STRONG RACE –

the first and unique extreme mass endurance race in the Baltics.



THEATRE –

theatre art has become a part of popular culture, travelling all over Latvia – both in the capital city and regions. Performances are staged by professionals as well as amateurs.



STARO RĪGA –

the annual Rīga festival of light visited by more than 500 thousand people in three days from all over Latvia, as well as by the visitors of the city.
